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BACKGROUND

- Rapid transition to telepractice during COVID-19 was challenging for many clinical services
- Evidence based telepractice models exist for a range of speech pathology (SP) services
- Surveys of speech pathologists have highlighted accessible information and training is required to support service implementation and sustainability (Hill & Miller, 2012; Raatz et al., 2020)
- Speech Pathology Australia has prioritised the development of a suite of educational resources to support SP telepractice services

AIM

To develop integrated digital training resources that provide speech pathologists across Australia with the tools to design, develop, implement and sustain their telepractice services

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

- Lead by two project officers, national working party and advisory group
- Comprising 25 speech pathologists with clinical, research and academic expertise in telepractice
- Resource content and structure guided by –
 - ✓ Recent practice survey results
 - ✓ Current published literature and evidence based practice
 - ✓ Professional telepractice service experience
 - ✓ Digital and eLearning methodology
- Speech Pathology Australia supported publication of resources on the *Learning Hub* – the Association's digital learning platform

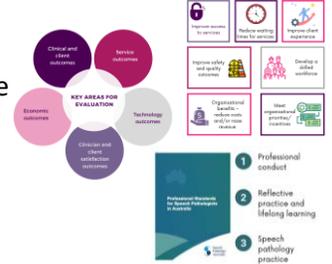
